The day begins with a procession during which the candidates for degrees march across the College Green, led by the chief marshal party, Brown band, presidential party, Corporation, senior administration, and faculty. In addition, alumni who have returned for reunions march with their classes. Once the last person is through the Van Wickle Gates on the front green, the procession inverts and continues down College street with each participant applauding the others.

The Medical School adjourns to the First Unitarian Church on Benefit and Benevolent streets. The Graduate School procession ends on Simmons Quadrangle, where a tent accommodates spectators; additional seating is available in Metcalf Friedman Auditorium, with viewing by simulcast.

The senior class marches down College, Benefit, and Waterman streets to the First Baptist Church in America and assembles on the lawn. Family and friends wait on the College Green, where large screens afford a continuous view of the proceedings. Afterward, the seniors walk up the hill and take seats on the College Green for the University ceremony.

Parents, relatives, and friends of seniors are advised to find seats on the College Green during the opening procession. The best opportunity to take photographs of graduating seniors is at the diploma ceremonies in the afternoon. In addition, the Van Wickle Gates will remain open for photographs until 6 p.m. on Monday.

THE MEETING HOUSE OF THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH IN AMERICA

The Meeting House, completed in 1775, was built "for the Publick Worship of Almighty God, and also for holding Commencement in." Central parts of the Brown Commencement ceremonies have been held here ever since. Moreover, during their tenure three Brown presidents were also ministers of this church, and all of the presidents who held office between 1764 and 1937 were Baptist clergy. The conferral of baccalaureate degrees will take place on the grounds of the Meeting House and continue with the senior orations at the University ceremony on the College Green. Today's ceremonies keep the class of 2013 together and maintain a meaningful portion of the Commencement ceremony on the Meeting House grounds.

In the event of severe weather conditions, the storm plan will go into effect and the Commencement procession will be cancelled.

The University ceremony will be moved indoors and begin at noon. **Seniors** should report directly to the Pizzitola Sports Center by 11:30 a.m. Family and guests of seniors should go to Salomon Center, Sayles Hall, or Meehan Auditorium for a simulcast of the University ceremony. The ceremony will also be live webstreamed at www.brown.edu. Diploma ceremonies will be held in the assigned locations following the University ceremony. Should graduating students want to pass through the Van Wickle Gates, they will remain open until 6 p.m. on Monday.

Ph.D. candidates should report directly to the west-facing entrance of Barus and Holley (the eastern end of Manning Walk) and **master's recipients** should report to the lobby of MacMillan Hall by 9 a.m. to line up for the procession to the Graduate School ceremony on Simmons Quadrangle. Family and guests of graduate students should go to the tent on Simmons Quadrangle for the 10:15 a.m. ceremony; additional seating is available in Metcalf Friedman Auditorium and in MacMillan Hall 117 and 115, with viewing by simulcast. The ceremony may be viewed by webstreaming at www.brown.edu.

Medical School degree candidates should report directly to the First Unitarian Church by 11 a.m. Family and guests of medical students should go to the Unitarian Church for the 11:15 a.m. ceremony.

Brown University's 19th President

CHRISTINA H. PAXSON



Christina H. Paxson was sworn in as the nineteenth president of Brown University on Monday, July 2, 2012. At the time of her appointment in March 2012, she was dean of the Woodrow Wilson School of International and Public Affairs and the Hughes-Rogers Professor of Economics and Public Affairs at Princeton University.

A 1982 honors graduate of Swarthmore College, Phi Beta Kappa, Paxson earned her graduate degrees in economics at Columbia University (M.A., 1985; Ph.D., 1987). She began her academic career at Princeton University in 1986, becoming assistant professor of economics and public affairs the next year. She became a full professor in 1997 and was named the Hughes-Rogers Professor of Economics and Public Affairs in 2007. Graduate students at the Woodrow Wilson School have given her five annual awards for teaching excellence.

Initially working on international economic problems of labor supply, mobility, savings, inequality, and aging, Paxson focused increasingly on the relationship of economic factors to health and welfare over the life course, particularly on the health and welfare of children. In 2000, she founded the Center for Health and Wellbeing, an interdisciplinary research center in the Woodrow Wilson School. The center established multidisciplinary graduate and undergraduate certificate programs in health and health policy. She served as the center's director until 2009.

Paxson also has served as associate chair (2005-08) and chair (2008-09) of the Department of Economics at Princeton and was the founding director of a National Institute on Aging Center for the Economics and Demography of Aging at Princeton. She was elected vice president of the American Economics Association in 2012 and is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. She has been the principal investigator on a number of research projects supported by the National Institutes of Health, the most recent of which is a study of adversity and resilience after Hurricane Katrina.

As dean of the Woodrow Wilson School, Paxson oversaw significant changes in the undergraduate major in public and international affairs, which included eliminating selective admissions and revamping the curriculum to place greater emphasis on multidisciplinary learning, independent research, and field experience in the United States and internationally.

Paxson is married to Ari Gabinet, currently executive vice president and general counsel of Oppenheimer Funds. They have two sons, Nicholas and Benjamin.

Brown Commencement Traditions



Commencement day at Brown University is a time of great ceremony, pageantry, and rejoicing, much of it representing traditions that are centuries old. These notes on the history, setting, and action of the Brown Commencement are offered in the hope that they will add to your enjoyment of this unique academic celebration.

COMMENCEMENT HISTORY

The seventh-oldest college in the United States, Brown was founded in 1764 as the College of the Colony of Rhode Island under the leadership of the Rhode Island Baptists.

The first Commencement was held on September 7, 1769, in what was then the College's home, the Baptist Meeting House in Warren, Rhode Island, 10 miles south of Providence. Seven young men were awarded degrees. The institution moved to Providence the following year, and in 1804 it acquired its present name in honor of a major benefactor, Nicholas Brown of Providence, class of 1786.

For the six years prior to the Declaration of Independence, Commencement ceremonies were held in Father Snow's Meeting House in downtown Providence, now Beneficent Congregational Church. In 1776 the ceremony moved to the First Baptist Meeting House, built in 1774-75 to house the oldest Baptist church in America, founded by Roger Williams in 1638, the second year of his exile from the Massachusetts Bay Colony. The meeting house was erected "for the publick Worship of Almighty GOD and also for holding Commencement in." A National Historic Landmark, it was completely restored in 1958 through a gift from the late John D. Rockefeller Jr., class of 1897.

In the early days Brown's Commencement was known as "the festival of Providence," widely attended by enthusiastic townsmen. So disorderly was their conduct that in 1791, the Rhode Island General Assembly passed a law requiring the high sheriff of Providence County to attend all Commencements "to preserve the peace, good order, and decorum in and about the Meeting House." The law still stands and the sheriff still marches, identifiable by full evening dress, high silk hat, blue sash, and sword.

During the 20th century, members of Brown's alumni classes began to hold their five-year reunions to coincide with Commencement weekend. Today more than 4,000 alumni and their families return to College Hill each year for a series of events capped by the Commencement procession on Sunday morning.

THE PROCESSION

Sunday morning, while the Commencement procession passes through Faunce Arch onto the College Green, the Brown Band begins to play the lilting "Brown Commencement March," arranged by the late Wally Reeves. The music is punctuated by the pealing of the College bell, which has rung from the cupola of University Hall since 1791; it is joined by the Meeting House bell, imported from England in 1775.

As the procession marches from the campus down College Hill to the Meeting House, it passes through the Van Wickle Gates, which swing open only twice a year: inward to admit the first-year class at Opening Convocation in the fall and outward on Commencement Day to discharge the degree candidates.

The parade is led by the chief marshal, a member of the 50-year reunion class, and by the chief and assistant chief of staff. They are followed by the color guard and alumni aides and marshals from various reunion classes. The men traditionally dress in top hats and tails, while women wear academic robes. The faculty, thousands of alumni, the graduating seniors, medical students, and graduate students, members of the Brown Corporation, invited guests, and the presidential party round out the procession. At one point, the procession stops and forms an inversion to allow each marcher to pass by all the others, to mutual applause.

THE OFFICERS

Prominent among the marchers are members of the Brown Corporation, the University's governing body, consisting of 12 fellows and 42 trustees. They can be identified by their large, floppy "trencher" hats, which were approved for use by the Brown Corporation in 1912 to provide a distinctive alternative to the traditional academic cap. Other colleges and universities have subsequently adopted the style. Robes, designed and adopted in 1968, are of the University's colors: seal brown and cardinal red, with black velvet trim.

Invited guests include candidates for honorary degrees, U.S. senators and congressional representatives from Rhode Island, the governor of Rhode Island, and the mayor of Providence. The presidential party – the president, the senior fellow, the chancellor, the vice chancellor, and the chaplain – is led by a mace bearer who is a faculty member and a Brown alumnus.

THE MACE

Once a weapon used to crush an opponent's armor, the mace has evolved into a symbol of authority. Brown's mace, which weighs more than 20 pounds, was given to the University in 1928. It is adorned with symbols from Brown's past and with the names of its presidents and prominent 19th-century alumni. The mace is carried in processions at the opening of the academic year, at Commencement, and at ceremonies where honors or degrees are to be awarded.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

The president's academic gown, and the golden chain and pendant that adorn her neck, became the official presidential regalia during the University's bicentennial celebration in 1964-65; the robe was designed by the late Anne S.K. (Mrs. John Nicholas) Brown, an expert on military and ceremonial dress. The caps, gowns, and hoods of others in the procession represent a tradition of academic dress that began in the 12th and 13th centuries, when cold stone buildings housed medieval universities. The gowns were an adaptation of clerical garb.

ACADEMIC HOODS

A scholar's hood, worn around the neck and hanging down the back, denotes degree, field, and alma mater. The band of velvet circling the outer edge of the hood varies in width according to the highest degree attained: narrow for the bachelor's degree, medium for the master's, and broad for the doctorate. The color represents the field of scholarship: arts and letters, white; economics, copper; education and pedagogy, light blue; engineering, orange; humanities, crimson; law, purple; medicine, kelly green; music, pink; philosophy, blue; science, gold; and theology, scarlet. The hood is lined with the colors of the institution attended by the wearer. A Brown University hood is lined in seal brown crossed by a broad band of cardinal red.

THE CANE

The cane carried by the president of the Brown Alumni Association serves as the symbol of that office. It is made of oak taken from University Hall when the building was reconstructed during the 1880s.

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKERS

Unlike most colleges and universities, Brown imports no Commencement speaker for the College ceremonies. On the College Green on Commencement morning, two members of the senior class, selected by a faculty committee, deliver short orations.

CONFERRING OF DEGREES

The conferring of bachelor's degrees is accomplished verbally on the grounds of the Meeting House, and the presentation of symbolic diplomas comes later on the College Green. Still later in the day, the seniors receive their actual diplomas at separate disciplinary ceremonies.

The words spoken by the president on the grounds of the Meeting House are:

Socii honorandi: Juvenes quos ad gradum Baccalauri idoneos comperimus, vobis praesentamus, et eos ad hunc gradum promovere liceat rogamus. Candidati ad gradum Baccalauri auscultabunt. Auctoritate mihi commissa vos ad gradum Baccalauri admitto, omniaque jura ac privilegia ad hunc gradum pertinentia, vobis concedo. In huius rei testimonium diplomata

vestris conlegis in Collegii Gramine tradam.

Honorable Fellows: The youths whom we have found to be qualified for the bachelor's degree we now present to you, and we ask that they may come forward for the awarding of the degree. May the candidates for the bachelor's degree listen attentively. Through the authority entrusted to me I admit you to the bachelor's degree, and all the rights and privileges associated with this degree I confer upon you. In testimony thereof I will presently deliver your diplomas to your representatives on the College Green.

After the president pronounces the awarding of the bachelor's degrees, all degree recipients return to the Green for the University Ceremony.

The Graduate School and Medical School have separate convocations for the awarding of master's degrees, Ph.D.s, and M.Ds.

THE UNIVERSITY CEREMONY

Following the senior orations, the ceremony takes place. The president takes her seat in the centuries-old Manning Chair, which once belonged to Brown's first chancellor, Stephen Hopkins, a signer of the Declaration of Independence and an early Rhode Island governor. It was used by Brown's first president, James Manning, and has seated successive presidents at their inaugurations and on Commencement Day. During the ceremony on the College Green, the president bestows diplomas on representatives of each category of baccalaureate degree and then speaks this admonition: *Videte igitur ut probe, integreque, in emolumentum rei publicae et in Dei honorem, ut decet eos hoc gradu honoratos vos geratis.* "Take care that you conduct yourselves, with probity and integrity to the credit of the state and the honor of God, as befits those who have been honored with this degree."

The ceremony continues with the conferring of the honorary degrees. A benediction concludes the formalities on the College Green.

Separate diploma ceremonies, inaugurated in 1974, are conducted by department chairs immediately following the ceremony on the Green. Each ceremony is attended by the faculty of the department, the degree recipients, and their parents and guests. The ceremony sites are listed at the end of the Commencement program.

BENJAMIN AFFLECK
Doctor of Fine Arts (D.F.A.)



Ben Affleck is a two-time Academy Award winner who has been recognized for his work as a director, actor, writer, and producer.

Affleck most recently directed, produced and starred in the award-winning *Argo*, a fact-based drama about the then-classified mission to rescue six Americans trapped in Iran during the hostage crisis. The most acclaimed film of 2012, *Argo* swept the year's top honors, including the Oscar, Golden Globe and BAFTA Award for Best Picture. Affleck also won Golden Globe, BAFTA, and Critics' Choice Awards for Best Director, and was

nominated for a BAFTA Award for Best Actor.

Affleck made his directorial debut in 2007 with the feature *Gone Baby Gone*, for which he earned several critics groups' awards, including the Best Directorial Debut Award from the National Board of Review. Additionally, he won the Breakthrough Director of the Year Award at the 2007 Hollywood Film Festival. Affleck also co-wrote the screenplay for the film, adapted from the Dennis Lehane novel.

In 2010, Affleck directed and starred in *The Town*, in addition to co-writing the screenplay. The film was named among the top 10 films of the year by the American Film Institute, and the cast won the National Board of Review Award for Best Ensemble. Affleck received a Writers Guild of America Award nomination for *The Town*, which also brought Oscar, Golden Globe and Screen Actors Guild Award nominations to co-star Jeremy Renner.

Affleck first came to prominence in 1997 with the acclaimed drama *Good Will Hunting*, which he starred in and co-wrote with Matt Damon. The two won an Academy Award for Best Original Screenplay, as well as a Golden Globe Award and Humanitas Prize. The following year, Affleck starred in John Madden's Oscar-winning *Shakespeare in Love*, sharing in a Screen Actors Guild Award for Outstanding Motion Picture Cast.

In addition to his successful film career, Affleck is a passionate advocate and philanthropist. In March 2010, he founded the Eastern Congo Initiative, the first U.S.-based advocacy and grant-making initiative wholly focused on the mission of helping the people of eastern Congo support local community-based approaches that create a sustainable and successful society in the long-troubled region. Affleck is also a longtime political activist, as well as a strong supporter of many charitable organizations, including Feeding America, Paralyzed Veterans of America, A-T Children's Project and the Jimmy Fund.

JUNOT DÍAZ
Doctor of Letters (Litt.D.)



Junot Díaz is the Rudge and Nancy Allen Professor of Writing at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and fiction editor at *Boston Review*. He is the author of the critically acclaimed *Drown*; *The Brief Wondrous Life of Oscar Wao*, which won the 2008 Pulitzer Prize and the National Book Critics Circle Award; and *This Is How You Lose Her*, a *New York Times* bestseller and National Book Award finalist.

In 2012, Díaz was named a MacArthur Fellow by the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation, which said of him:

“Junot Díaz is a writer whose finely crafted works of fiction offer powerful insight into the realities of the Caribbean diaspora, American assimilation, and lives lived between cultures. Born in the Dominican Republic and living in the United States since adolescence, Díaz writes from the vantage point of his own experience, eloquently unmasking the many challenges of the immigrant's life. With skillful use of raw, vernacular dialogue and spare, unsentimental prose, he creates nuanced and engaging characters struggling to succeed and often invisible in plain sight to the American mainstream.”

Díaz emigrated to the United States when he was turning six, arriving in New Jersey, where he lived with his father. He attended public schools in New Jersey and began undergraduate studies at Kean College, transferring to Rutgers College, where he earned his B.A. in English in 1992. He earned his M.F.A. from Cornell University in 1995.

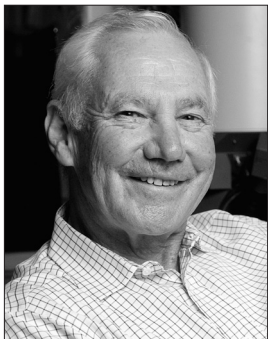

Henry Award, the Rome Prize from the American Academy of Arts and Letters, and other honors.

STANLEY FALKOW
Doctor of Science (Sc.D.)



Stanley Falkow, a 1961 Ph.D. graduate of Brown University, is widely regarded as one of the most productive, inventive, and influential bacteriologists of a generation. His observations and research into the molecular mechanisms of bacterial pathogenesis — how bacteria invade healthy host cells and cause disease — have inspired the research careers of many Ph.D. graduates from his lab and have advanced the world health struggle against a variety of endemic diseases.

Falkow began his career as a microbiologist at the Walter Reed Army Institute of Research

in the Department of Bacterial Immunology. He held academic positions at Georgetown University Medical School and the University of Washington Medical School before arriving at the Stanford University School of Medicine in 1981. He pioneered infectious disease research through his recognition of the role of plasmids in antibiotic resistance and laid the foundation for the field of molecular bacterial pathogenesis. Among his achievements are the first molecular cloning of a microbial virulence factor, the first identification of a bacterial factor responsible for host cell entry, and the elucidation of key virulence determinants in some of the world's most dangerous bacteria, including *Salmonella*, *E. coli*, *Bordetella*, *Yersinia*, and *Helicobacter*.

Microbiologists who have trained with Falkow speak of his love of science, of his native curiosity, and of his ability to inspire the spirit of scientific inquiry. They speak also of his generous spirit, of his practice of allowing students and postdoctoral researchers to take whatever they wanted from his lab as they left to start careers elsewhere. For his part, Falkow has said he does not consider that a matter of generosity, but of fairness: "I learned far more from them than they ever did from me." He is also very supportive of women in science. At least half of his students have been women, most of them now highly successful scientists.

Although he continues to teach, Falkow retired from the Stanford School of Medicine in the spring of 2010 to pursue less scientific interests including fly fishing and flying. (He earned his pilot's license at the age of 72.) His achievements in a long laboratory career have brought him many international honors, among them election to the U.S. National Academy of Sciences, election as a foreign member of the Royal Society, and the prestigious Lasker-Koshland Special Achievement Award in Medical Science.

BEVERLY WADE HOGAN
Doctor of Humane Letters (L.H.D.)



Beverly Wade Hogan has devoted her professional career to the well-being of the people of Mississippi. She has coordinated health services, championed and administered mental health programs, served as a commissioner for worker compensation, and provided leadership for a number of government agencies and nonprofit organizations. In 2002, after six years on its Board of Trustees and five years in its executive ranks, she accepted the presidency of Tougaloo College, her alma mater.

Born in Crystal Springs, Miss., the youngest of five children, Hogan grew up in a household that was very involved in community affairs. "I was encouraged along those lines," she told an interviewer at the *Planet Weekly* in Jackson, "so as I grew up, I naturally took on the role of wanting to make a difference in my community."

She majored in psychology (B.A., 1973), working during her student years as a health services coordinator at the nonprofit Friends of Children of Mississippi. After graduation, she worked at the Hinds County Mental Health Association, beginning as a therapist and then serving as executive director for eight years. In 1983 she became executive director of the Mississippi Mental Health Association. She helped organize a rape crisis center, a shelter for battered women, and Mississippi's first psychiatric halfway house. President Carter made her a delegate to the 1980 White House Conference on Families.

She began 14 years of service in government as CEO of the Governor's Office of Federal State Programs, overseeing the administration of all federally funded projects in the state. Her service included 10 years as a commissioner with the Mississippi Workers Compensation Commission and, in her private life, service as a United Way volunteer, state chair of the Campaign for the United Negro College Fund, and national service as a member of President Obama's board of advisers for Historically Black Colleges and Universities. She also earned a master's degree in public policy and administration from Jackson State University in 1990.

Her entry to higher education administration began with service on the Tougaloo Board, from 1991 to 1997. She began working for Tougaloo as the founding director of the Owens Health and Wellness Center and executive assistant to the president, and was named vice president for institutional advancement in 2000. As president, she has added new degree programs, an honors program, and three new research centers, including the Center for Civic Engagement and Social Responsibility. A series of renovations during her tenure, including the Bennie G. Thompson Academic and Civil Rights Research Center, has transformed the Tougaloo environment.

Brown honors Hogan as the University and Tougaloo College prepare to mark the 50th anniversary of an extraordinary partnership. The two institutions signed their partnership agreement on May 18, 1964, the 10th anniversary of the Supreme Court's landmark *Brown v. Board of Education* decision.

RISA LAVIZZO-MOUREY
Doctor of Medical Science (D.M.S.)



Risa Lavizzo-Mourey is president and CEO of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, a position she has held since 2003. The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation is the nation's largest philanthropy dedicated solely to health and health care.

Raised in Seattle by parents who both were practicing physicians, Lavizzo-Mourey knew she wanted to be a doctor since childhood. She did her undergraduate work at the University of Washington and the State University of New York at Stony Brook and earned her medical degree from Harvard

Medical School. Lavizzo-Mourey completed her residency in internal medicine at Brigham & Women's Hospital in Boston and was a Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholar at the University of Pennsylvania. She trained in geriatrics at Penn and earned an M.B.A. from the Wharton School.

With her training in geriatrics, Lavizzo-Mourey served the University of Pennsylvania as the Sylvan Eisman Professor of Medicine and Health Care Systems. She also directed the Institute on Aging and was chief of geriatric medicine at the University of Pennsylvania's School of Medicine. She was known for making house calls and creating caregiving teams with other specialists and nurse practitioners to better serve her patients.

As president and CEO of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, Lavizzo-Mourey has supported research and implemented programs that address the nation's most pressing health issues, working toward a national culture of health. Those efforts include reversing the childhood obesity epidemic, containing the rising cost of health care, expanding the role of highly trained nurses, addressing social factors that impact the public's health, ensuring universal access to health care, and supporting a new generation of health leaders.

At the federal level, Lavizzo-Mourey has served on the White House Health Care Reform Task Force and on numerous federal advisory committees, including the Task Force on Aging Research, the National Committee for Vital and Health Statistics, and the President's Advisory Commission on Consumer Protection and Quality in the Health Care Industry. She co-chaired a congressionally requested Institute of Medicine study on racial and ethnic disparities in health care.

Lavizzo-Mourey is a member of the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences; the President's Council for Fitness, Sports and Nutrition; and several boards of directors. She is the recipient of numerous honors and awards, including commendations for her work from the Harvard School of Public Health, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the American College of Physicians, the National Library of Medicine, the American Medical Women's Association, the National Medical Association, and the University of Pennsylvania.

EDUARDO J. PADRÓN
Doctor of Humane Letters (L.H.D.)



Eduardo J. Padrón, recognized as among the nation's most successful college and university presidents, has led Miami Dade College — the nation's largest institution of higher learning, with 175,000 students — since 1995. During his presidency, Miami Dade College has become a model for a "culture of success" built on student access, retention, graduation, and overall achievement. It enrolls and graduates more minorities than any other institution of higher education in the United States, including the largest numbers of Hispanics and African Americans.

When he was 15 years old, Padrón arrived in the United States with his younger brother as refugees under Operation Peter Pan (*Operación Pedro Pan*), a federal project through which Cuban parents sent more than 14,000 children to the United States for placement with friends, relatives, or in group homes in 35 states. He finished high school in Florida, learning English and working several jobs to support himself and his brother. College was a dream that remained strong, though remote, as rejections arrived in the mail.

He found what he needed — strong faculty and administrative support, fellow students with similar dreams and ambitions, a growing sense of confidence — in a new college then called Dade County Junior College. He continued his studies, earning his bachelor's degree *summa cum laude* from Florida Atlantic University and his Ph.D. in economics from the University of Florida. Teaching and educational administration at Miami Dade College became his life's work.

That work, according to *TIME*, which named Padrón one of the nation's 10 best college presidents, has been to "revolutionize the role of two-year community colleges in the U.S., raising their academic stature while preserving their mission to teach underserved populations." He has added honors programs and four-year degrees, maintaining high academic standards while broadening access for students. "It's about combining open access and excellence," he has said.

His efforts at Miami Dade have been widely recognized and appreciated. Six U.S. presidents have appointed him to various advisory posts, and President Obama has appointed him chair of the White House Commission on Educational Excellence for Hispanic Americans. He is past chair of the American Council on Education (ACE) and the Association of American Colleges and Universities (AACU). Padrón has held leadership positions on the American Academy of Arts and Sciences Humanities Commission and on the boards of the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching, the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities (chair), the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, Campus Compact, and the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute. He is a board member of the Council on Foreign Relations and an Ascend Fellow at the Aspen Institute. He has received more than 15 honorary doctorates and high honors from the governments of foreign nations, including the *Commandeur* in the *Ordre des Palmes Académiques* (France), the Order of San Martin (Argentina), and the Order of Queen Isabella (Spain, bestowed by King Juan Carlos II).

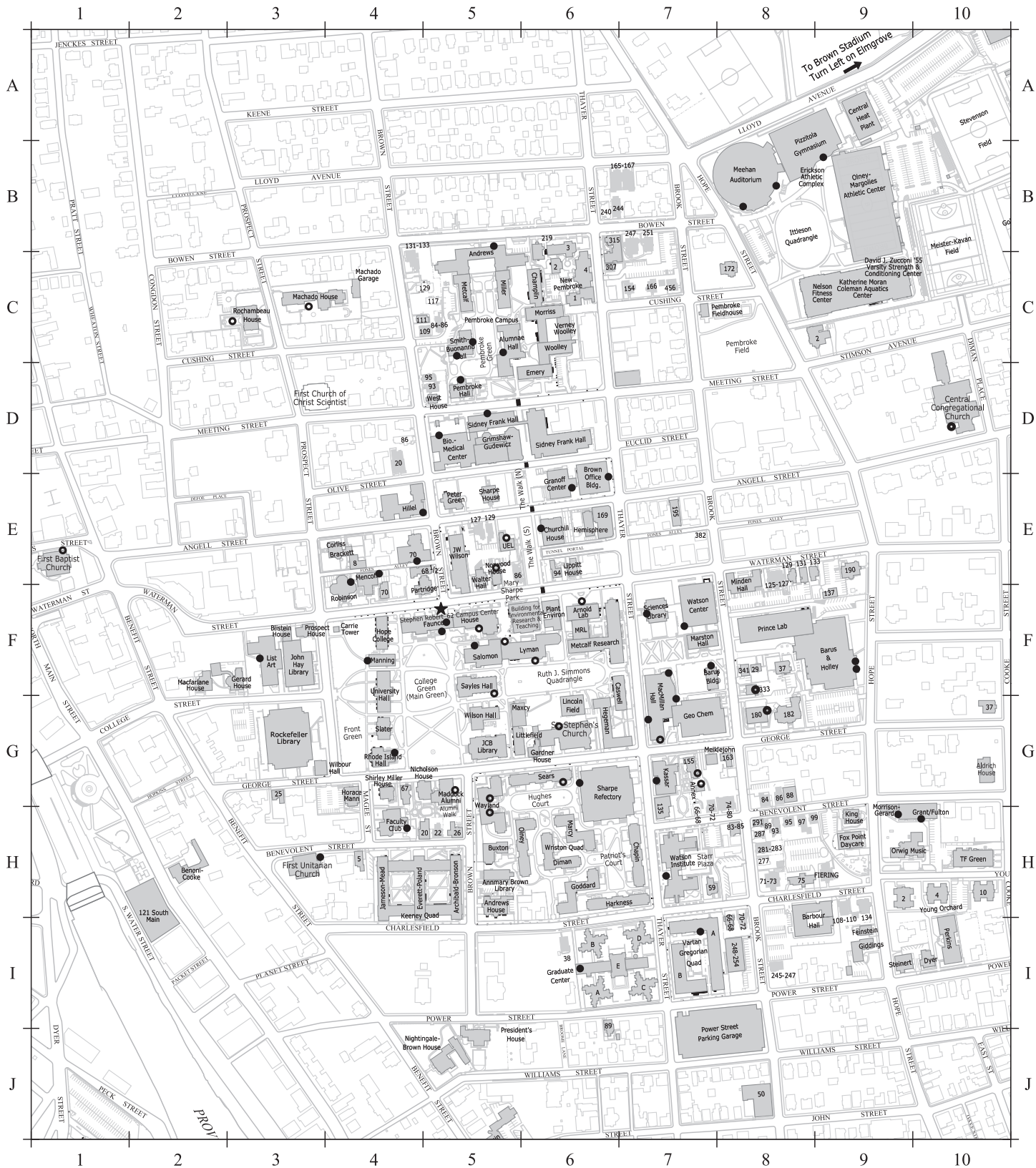
